


Riverview Lodge is situated in the heart of trophy brown trout country, in the South

Located right on the banks of the Owen River in the Murchison/ Nelson Lakes region, the lodge provides guests with panoramic views encompassing Kahurangi National Park and Mount Owen and access to top fishing.





Secluded in the Taharua Valley, Poronui boasts access to 500k acres of private land and some of the country's greatest wilderness experiences.

The property has almost 25 miles of water and adjacent are vast estates of privately owned Maori land. The exclusivity and remoteness of these rivers and streams make it some of the most prized fishing waters.
